### How can I keep professional relationships going authentically?

They've accepted your LinkedIn invitation. Now what?

#### Five ideas for future **SINCERE** touchpoints:

- 1. You interact with one of their posts/comments by "reacting" and/or commenting
  - Use your own words. The GenAl tool will give you suggestions that sound like everybody else
- 2. You took action on something they posted about and it worked out! Tell them about it in a comment or in a LI message and express gratitude
- 3. You connected with someone in their network or they otherwise served as a 'bridge person' for you. Tell them how that new connection was helpful to you (include a detail or two) and how you'll move forward. Thank them!
- 4. You experience a milestone
  - You graduated. You accepted a job offer. You moved. You're establishing yourself in a new career
    area or geographical area. You're embarking on a new project. You're seeking a job transition.
- 5. You come across a resource that might interest them or made you think of them.
